This year the annual e-Assessment Question Conference (www.e-assessment-question.com) takes place in London on the 10th and 11th April.

In its 17th year, the conference is even more relevant today than it was 17 years ago when e-assessment was in its infancy. The event this year promises to be one of the best yet, with key speakers from the industry and a full line-up of exhibitors. It's also a key moment in the conference's history.

The eAssessment Association have always supported the conference as part of its remit to bring together professionals from across the sector. For the past two years this has included the e-Assessment Awards evening which has further helped to raise the status of our industry. So, from 2020, Assessment Tomorrow and the eAA have agreed that the eAA will take over the running of the conference so that it becomes part of the eAA's annual cycle of events alongside the Awards.

Over the seventeen years we have seen lots of change. When we started the conferences it was all about proving that the systems were robust, that e-Assessment offered valid assessment that was more than just automated multiple choice tick-boxing, that it was scalable and could provide real high stakes assessments as well as supporting formative assessment, learning and teaching. Those arguments have more or less been won.

So, at the conference in April will look at issues like multiple item types, gamification, AI, big data, e-proctoring, BYOD and a host of related subjects. We will hear experts and practitioners discuss (and delegates debate!) the latest developments and hear about the latest projects in e-Assessment. We share experience and knowledge about what we have achieved, what is happening now and where we go in the future.

As the founders of the e-Assessment Question we're very pleased that we've come to this agreement with the eAA, and we are confident they will take the event to new heights! We still think the question implied in the conference title is relevant 17 years on. The innovative, imaginative and robust development of e-assessment in that time is reflected in the quality and variety of Award nominations and is a testament to the work of the sector.

But there are still deserts of non-use, not least the main public exams in the UK. Why?

So, as we pass the baton to the eAA, we'll support them in their efforts to build even bigger and better events.
