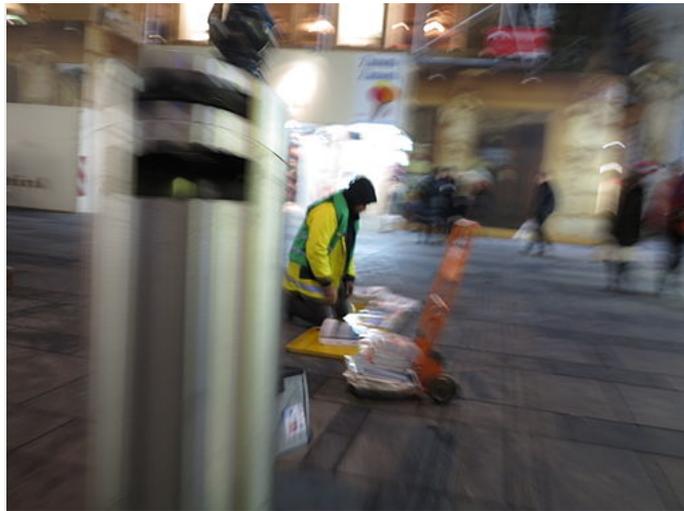

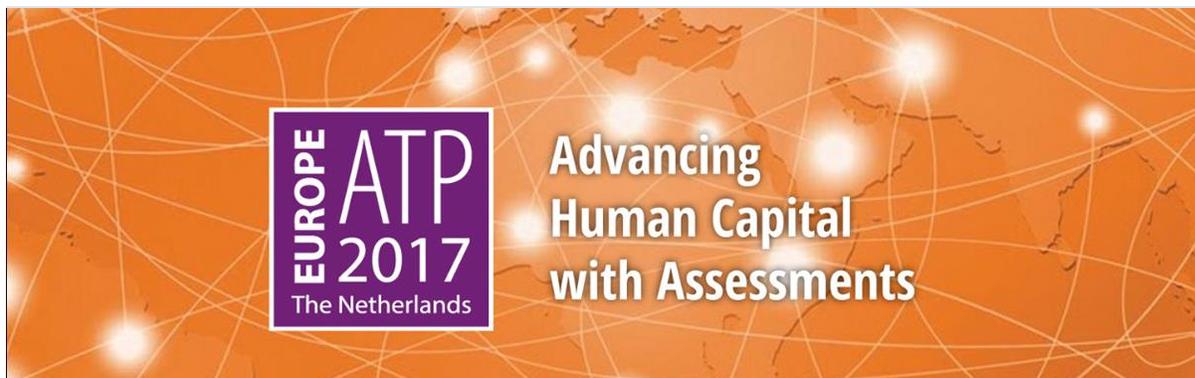

6 facts to know about ATP/E-ATP

The intelligent voice for testing

1. Established in 1992, The Association of Test Publishers (“ATP”) is an International non-profit organization representing providers of tests and assessment tools and/or services related to assessment for clinical, occupational, certification, licensure, educational or other similar uses.

2. ATPs’ membership is composed of the leading publishers and assessment service providers in today’s testing industry.

3. Presently there are four Regional Divisions that are active as subgroups of ATP’s global membership: Asia, India, Europe and North America. Regional Divisions provide added networking opportunities for members and provide a forum for the unique regional needs of assessment professionals in different geographic areas.

4. Europe-ATP (E-ATP) is the Regional Division that brings together European test publishers and related organisations for the purposes of networking, sharing innovative ideas and creating both educational and marketing opportunities related to testing and assessment in Europe.

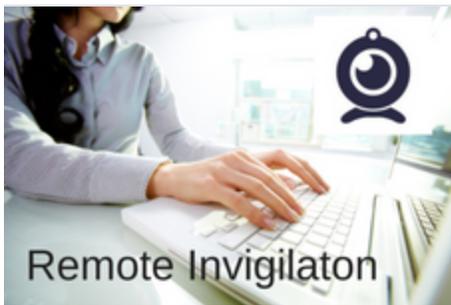
5. The mission of ATP remains the same throughout its Regions, though there may be a different emphasis placed on a particular aspect of the mission depending on the needs and cultural norms of the area. The mission of ATP and its Regional organisations is:

- To promote and preserve the general welfare of testing and its value to society, in all its forms and uses;
- To organize test publishers into a permanent body to foster and maintain collegial relations among themselves and to establish, through the Association, working relationships with other professional and business groups whose interests and activities affect the test publishing community;
- To encourage a high level of professionalism and business ethics throughout the testing community;
- To serve as the principal organization that monitors and responds to regulatory and legal rulings as well as legislative, regulatory and judicial initiatives that pertain to the business of publishing and applying test and assessment instruments;
- And, to increase the strength and cohesiveness of the test publisher community by providing programs of education, training and exchanges of ideas on operations and industry trends.

6. Some of the benefits of belonging to ATP include:

- Leadership opportunities that can provide professional growth and high quality educational experiences for you as a professional, or for your staff;

- Networking opportunities at the highest levels of the test publishing industry that help you enrich your contacts, enhance your career as a professional, and enhance the profile of your organization;
- The opportunity to be part of a community that provides important benchmarking information and opportunities for your business and industry;
- and the all-important “cross-pollination” opportunity -- Being part of a community that gets you outside of your own niche in testing and assessment, and allows you to engage with “parallel” niches that may provide you with a new way of looking at challenges, issues and solutions.



Case Study: Institute of Directors

How the Institute of Directors Used Online Assessment and Remote Invigilation to Transform their Certification Delivery

Who thought it would be possible for a company director to sit a certificate exam from their car, while being invigilated over the web?

While this is an unusual situation, members of the Institute of Directors (IoD) can now sit their exams using remote invigilation, which gives great flexibility, privacy and convenience.

Over an 18 month period, the IoD have worked with TestReach to transition their certification programme from a purely paper-based exam to being run online using remote invigilation.

The IoD team won the Team Contribution of the Year at the Federation of Awarding Bodies in 2016 and **Best Institute at the e-Assessment Awards in 2017** with their case around the successful implementation of computer based assessment and remote invigilation.

Reporting from Surpass Conference 2017

This year the e-Assessment Association was invited by one of the eAA's Founding Sponsor's, BTL, to their annual Surpass Conference.

I was there to promote the 2018 e-Assessment Awards and admit I was expecting a standard user-centric conference; however I was pleasantly surprised to find myself at an engaging and thought-provoking e-assessment event, with the thread running through being the evolving Surpass platform.

Here are the 6 key points that I personally took away from the event:

1. Steve Wheeler, an excellent keynote speaker, taught me the term Ipsative Assessment. Worth looking up if it's new to you.

The conference opened, as perhaps expected, with company and product updates from directors Sonya Whitworth and Andy McAnulla. Then Wheeler, who isn't a user of the software, or directly involved in assessment as an Awarding Organisation, delivered a fresh thinking approach as to how we might look towards assessments in the future.

2. BTL is expanding overseas, now working with the National Board of Medical Examiners (NBME) as well as Prometric. This is as big as it sounds.

The eAA recognises that e-assessment is not confined by national borders as the first year of the e-Assessment Awards proved, with strong entries coming in from every continent. So it was encouraging to see a company that has been working across Europe for years now, reaching in to the US and bringing back different, interesting ways of tackling every-day problems and alternative methods of reporting and testing.

3. Collaboration, Innovation and clever use of data in assessment is paving the way for some very exciting technical developments.

Ian Morgan from WJEC CBAC spoke about how the organisation is a huge advocate of using technology to enhance the assessment cycle (they developed the first general qualifications to be delivered on-screen in the UK). He revealed insights into how they are looking at e-assessment, e-portfolios and e-processing (the online marking of exam papers), all backed up by research from CCEA and QualWales. They are now working with a consortium including BTL and AlphaPlus Consultancy to deliver on-screen adaptive assessment from 2018.

4. UK based organisations are testing thousands of candidates overseas, and distance learning accounts for much more than we realise.

The Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales (ICAEW) has 25% of its students overseas, across 26 countries and over 150 different locations. Their speaker, Adam Birt gave me one of my favourite quotes of the day: "Technology should enable, not lead, assessment". Although testing overseas wasn't a deliberate topic of this session, it became clear throughout the course of the conference just how many awarding organisations rely on efficient, secure and stable technology to deliver their tests overseas.

5. Technology moves fast, and it's important for developers to keep up.

My second new term of the day was Scrum Development and is another one to look up if it's new to you. BTL are clearly using this style of dev at an impressive scale to rapidly deliver ongoing improvements as they pull on constant feedback from their clients and partners. I was also informed that BTL have covered this topic as part of their customer facing webinar series, recording of which will be made available soon.

6. Hold the front page. User Conferences can be entertaining!

There was a "Play" room where BTL staff were helping people on a bank of computers, but more than that, other delegates were sharing tips on how they use the system. Okay - that doesn't perhaps sound as fun as it looked, but we're looking forward to our invitation to next year's event apparently due to take place aboard the SS Great Britain in Bristol next October.

BTL have created a real international community without hierarchy, where everyone's input is welcomed. Everyone is aiming to improve both their use of the platform as well as aiming to help BTL with development and future direction. Very much a two-way (or even multi-way) approach. I spoke to Ben at BTL who told me the annual gathering of Surpass users is now in it's 10th year and summed it up nicely:

"It has grown to become so much more than an opportunity to gather product feedback. With a strong emphasis on knowledge sharing and problem solving, this event has given birth to the phrase 'Surpass Community' which sits firmly in line with our core conference objectives of transparency, innovation and collaboration." - Ben Brady, Marketing Assistant at BTL Group Ltd.

In 2014, the Bloomsbury Learning Environment (BLE) Consortium initiated a wide-ranging, two-year-long research and dissemination project focusing on the use of technology in assessment and feedback. Our aim was to understand and improve processes, practices, opportunities and tools available to the institutional members of the BLE Consortium. From the project, we produced three research papers investigating current practice and 21 case studies describing both technology-enabled pedagogy and technical development. Now presented as a free ebook, co-edited by Leo Havemann and Sarah Sherman, we offer the flavour of the variety and breadth of the BLE's activities relating to the project theme as a contribution to the education sector's widening conversation about the interplay of assessment, feedback, pedagogy and technology."
